- Awarded contract to Bell Construction Co for construction of Lytton/Patterson/Starks roadway, stormwater and sewer project.

- Approved sewer line extension on Houston Rd.

Recommends and develops parks, greenway systems, and recreational programs to benefit the citizens of Troutman.

Help with community events that might include activities that support Troutman- ESC Park, land planning, citizen surveys, downtown promotions, etc.

LEAF AND LIMB COLLECTION GUIDELINES

The annual leaf & limb schedule is available at Town Hall.
Take leaves and limbs to the curb in front of your house the day BEFORE THE FIRST COLLECTION DAY . If they are not out before the crew comes through, they will not be picked up.
Put leaves and limbs in separate piles.
Only limbs under 4" inches in diameter will be collected.
Limbs will not be picked up if they have been cut by professional tree cutters or trimmers.
DO NOT put leaves or limbs in bags.

LIVESTOCK & DOGS

The Town has rules regarding keeping the following animals inside the town limits:

- A maximum of 4 chicken hens are allowed for each single family lot. Roosters are not permitted. Chickens must be kept in a secure enclosure in the backyard (coops must be at least 10' from property lines).
- A maximum of 1 goat is allowed on residential properties one (1) acre or greater with an adequate fence and shelter provided. Goats must be kept a minimum of 150 feet from any town street, residence, or business.
- Horses must be kept a minimum of 150 feet from any town street, residence, or business. Other rules apply (contact Town Hall)
- All other livestock is prohibited.
- A maximum of 6 dogs shall be allowed upon residential property. Dogs off the owner's property must be kept on a leash 15' or less.
