COUNCIL BRIEFS

A Summary of Significant Council Actions

Regular Meeting of February 11, 2016

- Set March 10, 2016 as date for public hearing on voluntary annexation of 6 acres located at 227 Murdock Rd.
- Approved amendments to fee schedule to allow payment of a fee in lieu of sidewalk construction under certain conditions and increase engineer review fees by \$10/hour.
- Approved amendments to development ordinance regarding wireless telecommunication towers.
- Agreed to co-sponsor with Troutman Business Council Front Porch Fest to be held downtown on May 14.
- Made appointments to boards and committees.

LEAF AND LIMB COLLECTION GUIDELINES

The annual leaf & limb schedule is available at Town Hall.

Take leaves and limbs to the curb in front of your house **THE DAY BEFORE THE FIRST COLLECTION DAY**. If they are not out before the crew comes through, they will not be picked up.

Put leaves and limbs in separate piles.

Only limbs under 4" inches in diameter will be collected.

Limbs will not be picked up if they have been cut by professional tree cutters or trimmers.

DO NOT put leaves or limbs in bags.
