**Nuisance Fees**

Did You Know? The Town Board has recently adopted a nuisance abatement fee. The fee will allow the public works department to clean up/mow properties that have tall grass, junk piles, etc. after the resident has had a reasonable period (typically 10 days) to resolve the issue on their own.

**Recycling collection** is for in-town residents only. Benfield Sanitation collects recycling on **Wednesdays**. Your pickup day is based on your garbage pick up day. 

**TPD Neighborhood Watch Program**




**Keep Clippings in the Yard – Not in the Street**

Grass clippings in the street or sidewalk violate Town of Troutman ordinances. To avoid civil penalties ranging from \$15 to \$500, keep your road and sidewalk free of grass and debris. What to do with yard trimmings?

- Blow grass clippings back onto the lawn, where they become mulch and natural fertilizer.
- Rake or blow leaves into a compost pile, where they can decompose.
